

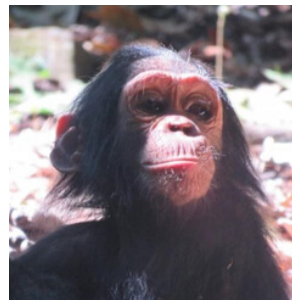

## TANZANIA AA+ GOMBE JANE GOODALL PROJECT

Kigoma coffee growing region is located in the north-west corner of Tanzania right at the western shores of Lake Tanganyika, reaching from the town of Kigoma all the way up north to the border to Burundi. The fertile volcanic soil with tropical rainforest cover provides ideal nutrition for the coffee trees. This coffee is named after Kigoma's Gombe National Park, most famous as the location where Jane Goodall pioneered her behavioral research conducted on the chimpanzee populations starting since the 1960s.

The local population lives and works around the animal reserve area and their social and economic activities narrows the wild habitats. In collaboration with the Jane Goodall institute, these Gombe special reserve coffees are dedicated to enable the producer communities to practice sustainable agriculture in harmony with wildlife. The concept developed by Jane Goodall actually prevents the chimps from getting into contact with humans. The animals don't like coffee thus the farms work like a "barrier of coffee trees" between the wild habitats of the chimps and other crops further down the slopes such as maize that would put them in direct confrontation with the local human population.

Additionally farmers receive extra premiums and trainings in quality control and environmental conservation in order to provide extra benefits and strengthen the direct link between growing coffee and wild life conservation.
